Highlights From FLC's July 8, 2025 Council Meeting



We have quite a few people who are in need of prayers and care. Please keep any members who are ill or experiencing challenges in your prayers.

Patti Reilly (FLC member) has come on board to fill our financial secretary position. She is adjusting well, fitting in well to the office and has been a great addition.

After talking about it last summer, this fall we are going to discontinue the sending of weekly bulletins to members in time for each Sunday's service. We will still offer, to those who desire it, to send the worship bulletins to members, but simply, the mail service has made the delivery of bulletins on time, unreliable. (It sometimes takes 5-6 business days for the bulletins to be received.) We will begin notifying members who receive them (about 12-15 at present) of this change this month and remind them again next month.

Old Business: Chimney Repair- Council has decided on Schaus installing a sidewall power vent: Schaus will have Hamann Construction remove and dispose of a section of the chimney to just above the roof line and cap the remaining chimney with a stainless steel cap. A commercial power vent draft inducer will be installed on the boiler breeching. An additional 10 feet of new boiler vent pipe will be installed inside of the remaining chimney and will terminate through the side of the chimney approximately 10 feet above grade to conform to code. The estimate for this work is \$42,343. We will need financial approval from the congregation and plan a congregational meeting on July 27, 2025 at 10:15 am.

New Business: Pastor Sauer invited our congregation to a multi-church worship and picnic in Union Park on August 17. Worship at 10:30 and picnic meal at 11:30. We will have church services as usual at FLC and then invite our members to go over to Union Park for worship and/or meal.

Please Note: All are welcome to listen in at the church council meetings which are held the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 6:30. If you have concerns, questions and comments, please reach out to our council president, Landie Van Haren, Pastor Andy or other council member.

A complete copy of the minutes, once approved at the following month's meeting, will be available on the bulletin board in the Fireside Room or in the church office.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

Grace and peace to you in the name of our living and loving Savior, Jesus the Christ!



When I began in ministry back in 2003 I knew that I would need some new ways to organize myself. Wonderfully, the ELCA and Augsburg Fortress had these little red date books, pocket-sized, that worked to record all my appointments. Those lasted, for me, for a few years but soon were replaced by a Blackberry device (anyone else remember those?) and that worked for quite a while to keep all my appointments and notes straight. I then started to hear about a new device, something called an iPhone, that would be able to do all of this and be a phone

at the same time. Well, I was skeptical and didn't buy that first iPhone but after a few years I was slowly won over, and now I can't imagine life without one. All of this has happened in just the past 20 years or so, life certainly has changed.

The iPhone, of course is only just the tip of the iceberg in the social change that we've seen in the last 10-20 years. Some of the changes we've seen I'm sure you don't like at all, some you love to hate, and some you have probably incorporated so thoroughly into your life that it is even hard to identify as something "new."

Our life in the church is and has undergone a significant change as well. As a pastor the thought used to be that we were being taught to marry, bury and baptize people as we served. Now, on an almost daily basis, the tasks and opportunities for ministry have rapidly (and necessarily) expanded.

We used to depend upon members being in church three to four times a month. Now, a regularly attending member might be someone who attends once a month or once every two months.

We also used to depend upon the community knowing who we are or at least that when they drove by our sign outside they would know what "First Lutheran Church" means. Now, it is not unreasonable to wonder if they know what "Lutheran" means and what they imagine when they read "Church."

In short, our world has shifted and we are rapidly trying to figure out how to catch up and live anew who God has called us to be. Things are just not the same any more – some of this is good, some of it we won't like but all of it can present challenges and opportunities for ministry.

Later this fall your council is going to continue our process looking at these changes and engaging in planning, discernment and action around how we can respond, reorganize and engage this moment of today. About a year and a half ago they commissioned several leaders to study these shifts in our culture and think through how we, First Lutheran Church, can move forward next.

I'm excited for this work to continue and for this process to keep moving. This is not something being done to us or for us but something that necessarily must and will involve us all. We are the body of Christ and the opportunity and challenge for ministry is there for us all. To engage this moment, we will need each of us.

I look forward to sharing more with you as the process continues and builds upon the great ministry and witness First Lutheran Church has had throughout these 175 years. God's not done with us yet, people of God. Let's see what is next!

THE HAUGIANS OF ST. PAUL LUTHERAN AND SCHISM AT FIRST

(Part Two)

The Haugian Lutherans brought with them a deep religious faith, so that establishing a place of worship was of utmost importance. On February 24, 1873, sixteen men and two women met, and with additional help from two pastors, one being Rev. Ludvig Bjørn of First Lutheran, they drew up a set of By-laws. The congregation's official name became "St. Paul Evangelical Norwegian Lutheran Church." Initially the Haugians rented the old school house owned by First Lutheran Church for worship.

However, in 1874 land was purchased on the west end of St. Claire street and parishioner Lars Olson erected a frame building at the cost of \$1,126.04. It was heated by a wood stove and lit by two large kerosene lamps. Rev. J.O. Hatlestad served as the first pastor. Keeping with their forward-thinking tradition, one of the three dedication services was done in the English language.

The building served the congregation well and numbers swelled. However, a major decision had to be made in 1898 when 25 members of First Lutheran Church severed their membership and made a request to join St. Paul Lutheran. The schism that ensued at First involved the predestination controversy that had riled Lutheran congregations since 1882 and continued to fester in the belly of the Lutheran Church. The question at hand was whether salvation was a free gift of grace, or whether some individuals had already been "predestined" by God for salvation. It pit theologians against theologians, synods against synods, and parishioners against parishioners, and is not a proud time in the history of the Lutheran Church. It also firmly separated the Missouri Synod from the Norwegian Evangelical Lutheran Church, where previously the two had worked harmoniously together.

With the swell in membership, St. Paul Lutheran erected a new church on their property and worshipped there until building a new facility on the south side of Manitowoc many years later.

In 1924, however, there was an attempt to unite the two Lutheran congregations, when First German Lutheran wished to expand and establish a Wisconsin Synod church on the north side. The thought was that St. Paul Lutheran could sell their property to the Wisconsin Synod and unite with First Lutheran. The resolution to unite required an 85% approval by each congregation. The resolution passed with 86% approval of First Lutheran, but the St. Paul congregation rejected the offer.


