



## Highlights From FLC's May 20th, 2025 Council Meeting



We have a number, unfortunately, of people who need care these days: Bill Pohlmann, Bob Larson, George Grinde (passed 6-13-25), Don Markwardt, Shirley Moen, Doris Hartman, and Karen Kinyon. May we hold these people in prayer.

**Financial Report:** Regular Giving is behind by 6,091.16. YTD we are ahead by 1,254.22. Balancing the annual budget is based on Lent/Easter cash money which is going this year toward the warming shelter.

**Old Business:** The First Lutheran Family Reunion service was great fun. Several former Pastors were in attendance and made some re-connecting possible. The organ recital in the afternoon was well attended by non-members and members alike. Dr. Freese was an outstanding performer and a great person to work with. Our October 12 celebration at the Franciscan Center is in the early stages of coordinating two choral/brass ensemble pieces that have been chosen and we are working to get players to fill the needed spots. A committee is looking at ways to make our church space more welcoming for our neighbors/visitors. They are looking at making a bathroom wheel chair accessible by adding a push button and adding changing tables to men's and women's bathrooms, having consistent signage, switching outdoor knobs to be able to lock some doors with the same key for safety, possibly changing the location of the AED and perhaps acquiring another one, and installing cameras on each floor, especially in areas not always in use.

**New Business:** The chimney 20 ft above the sanctuary roof has twisted and cracked around grout lines and bricks causing bricks to fall off. Multiple masons (3 or 4) were contacted and no one wanted to touch it. We should have a quote from Schaus this week to remove the bricks to the roofline, put a sleeve in and replace the chimney with a 20 ft metal tube from the roofline back to the current height. We will need financial approval from the Congregation and plan a Congregational meeting on June 8th. The Leadership Development committee and the council members are reading a book "Canoeing the Mountains" about Christian leadership in uncharted territory. It looks at what effective leadership looks like in our rapidly changing world.

If you have concerns, questions and comments, please reach out to our council president, Landie Van Haren, Pastor Andy or other council members. # A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

Grace and Peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ!

"On this mountain the LORD of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-aged wines strained clear. And he will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations; he will swallow up death forever. Then the Lord GOD will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the LORD has spoken." Isaiah 25:6-9

I remember during my time at Wartburg Seminary that we had a program where you could sign up and supply preach at local area churches that didn't have a pastor for a Sunday service. It was a valuable resource for area churches, but also for us as students. We would travel to area churches and try our best to perfect our craft while they taught us about faithfulness in the world today. Some of the churches were just like First Lutheran, while others were very rural congregations that were quite small. I remember, in some of those places, pausing to think about the generations of faithful people – lay people and Pastors – who had once sat in those pews, stood in the pulpit, played at the organ or piano, and listened to passages like the one above. It all made me pause ...

We live in a world that wants to look at things in linear ways. We like to believe that we move from one moment to the next on a steady slope of progress. We like to believe that we are gradually, if but slowly, progressing toward a better and brighter day. The only problem with this belief is that time and time again it has been proved to be largely false. Instead, we have found out that many of the things we count on as progress usually wind up having some sort of unintended consequences over time. These unintended consequences (and even the intended ones) set us back, and we again find ourselves in a place where we need to once more get out of the miry mess we've placed ourselves in and find a new day. Basically, the truth is that instead of living in a linear sort of way, we are much more cyclical in our living than we would like to acknowledge. The ups and downs of our lives repeat themselves, and at each new stage, we aren't progressing as much as we are adapting and moving forward in a new way.

I thought of things like this sitting in those old, small churches, and I still think of them from time to time hearing that passage from Isaiah. There, in those pews, pulpits, pianos, and in ours too, are the visible marks of people who knew that the feast Isaiah mentions has occurred, does occur, and will occur again and again. God had wiped away all their tears once before and, we pray, may it happen once more.

We have those "marks of faithfulness" all around us here at First Lutheran. We've been in a place before of being on the verge of doing something new. Sometimes those "new" things have worked, sometimes they haven't. And yet here we are again, on our knees, praying that God will again do a new thing here in our midst.

We are living in an unknown time. The marks and works of faithfulness of past, bygone eras doesn't quite translate in the same way to the new generations of people outside our doors. And we are turning to God, once again, seeking the source of our life for what will be, rather than just building off of what we have known. It is hard to do this. But it has been the faithful journey of people from the time of Jesus to today. We need a level of experimentation in this time and ability to trust that the One who attended to those who have left all their visible marks of faithfulness all around us will again be faithful in our time today. May we trust in the promise Isaiah articulated so long ago as we ever seek to move forward in our time like faithful people

did in his.



# THE HAUGIANS OF ST. PAUL LUTHERAN AND SCHISM AT FIRST

(Part One)

The Manitowoc Tribune reported on July 13, 1871, that "quite a large group of Norwegians arrived during the past week," and editorialized that "they make as good of citizens as any nationality from the old country, and we cannot have too many of them at any time."

Who were these Norwegians? The time frame of the article corresponds with the arrival of a group of Haugian Lutherans. These were Norwegian Christians who were followers of Hans Nielsen Hauge.

Hauge, a peasant farmer and a man of deep religious faith, challenged the well-established Church of Norway by becoming a popular lay preacher, though he had no formal theological training. His popularity grew because he mingled and preached among the common folk of Norway and espoused democracy, the equality of the sexes, and the right of parishioners to meet and discuss the Bible in their own homes without an ordained pastor present. This was certainly different from what the peasant population was accustomed to, since the ordained clergy of the Church of Norway was considered part of the upper class and, except for preaching and the administration of church rites, had little direct contact with the poorer elements of the population.

Why didn't these Norwegians settle on the south side of the city? This researcher has never confirmed that the Haugians all settled on the north side, but it would certainly seem that the majority probably did by virtue of the fact that their first church was built north of the river.

Additionally, just like today, new immigrants seek out their own kind. They want to live among those who speak their native language and share cultural similarities. This communication allows them the support needed to adjust to their new homeland and gradually meld into American society.

Why didn't they just become members of First Lutheran? Reverend Ludvig Bjørn of First Lutheran very much wanted to bring these new Norwegians under his fold, but there was resistance on both sides. Rev. Bjørn even traveled to Norway to speak with church officials there about the situation, and they encouraged him to do all in his power to affect a union of all the north-side Norwegians at First Lutheran. But when he approached the new Norwegian Synod in this country, the answer was in the negative. The main sticking point was that the Haugians wished to meet in each other's homes for additional worship or Bible study without an ordained clergyman present, and they were unwilling to give up this practice in order to become members of the First Lutheran congregation. The Haugians also wanted regular Sunday services, but First Lutheran could not provide that since Rev. Bjørn served three different congregations, meaning services were held only once every three weeks at these respective churches.


