Highlights From FLC's Council Meeting December 12, 2023



Pastor's Report:

• The transition of our financial accounting to Burbey is going well. They will provide ongoing accounting support and generate clear and accurate financial reports for us beginning in January.

Old Business:

- Pat Nickels will help with the transition to Burbey and conclude her service to our church at the end of January. Thank you, Pat, for your years of faithful service!
- All of the new lighting has been installed and a few minor modifications to the circuitry will be completed in the coming weeks. The new lighting looks wonderful!!
- We continued our discussion regarding the budget for 2024. Budgeted expenses have been significantly higher than income in 2023 and the congregation may need to make some difficult decisions at the congregational meeting in January to balance the budget. Please look for more information from the council regarding this situation.
- The "Warm the Sanctuary" capital campaign to fund our new boiler began in early December. With a small percentage of pledge cards returned, we have already exceeded the goal! We thank God for the generosity of our congregation! Additional funds raised will be used to offset the budget deficit and strengthen our financial position moving into 2024. Those who were planning to make a contribution to the boiler but have not yet done so, will be asked to prayerfully consider still making a donation.

Please Note: All are welcome to listen in at the church council meetings which are held the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 6:30, except in July. If you have concerns, questions and comments, please reach out to our council president, Tyler Fellows, Pastor Andy or other council members. 

The Salvation Army was in need of 'kindness' from our First Lutheran Family as they had the largest number of needy

families and individuals in their "Adopt-A-Family" program **ever** this year. On that list were 615 individuals representing 132 families in Manitowoc County. They also had 200+ families on their Toy Shop list.

We adopted 40 of those individuals representing 11 families. Additionally, 8 individuals with First Lutheran connections were adopted. The overflowing bags given to the families showed your "kindness" to our community because of the hundreds of granted Wish List items in those bags. Gifts ranged from comforter sets to pillows to car cleaning supplies to pots and pans to cleaning supplies and to generous gift cards for the adults. Some of the children and teenagers' wishes that were granted were for arts and crafts supplies, Spiderman toys, Pokémon items, desk lamps, Legos, makeup sets, cozy blankets, Barbies, warm clothes, gift cards, games, and even a foldable purple chair.

Thank you for the 'kindness' you continue to show "that links us all together and strengthens the bonds within our community, neighborhoods, and our church family". Once again you have shown our God-given mission to "Go out to serve and invite others to faith in Christ" by your "kindness".

A year that whispers Jesus

For author Nancy Tichy, a small holiday gift once sparked big-picture thoughts about Christian living. One December she received a kitchen towel with the message "I want a Christmas that whispers JESUS." That prompted thoughts of what it's like to have an entire year that whispers Jesus.

For starters, that involves daily quiet time, devotion and prayer. "Sometimes I wake with the thought of a person on my mind," writes Tichy. "I'm quiet with this impression, interceding for the family member or friend until it has lifted. Could this be a whisper from our Savior?"

Many other daily occurrences are "worthy of [Jesus'] whispered response of love," Tichy points out. That's true whether we're distracted by tasks and troubling thoughts or buoyed by encounters with contentment and joy. "For me," she writes, "whispering is part of intimacy, and that is what I want to make a hallmark of the coming year. I want closeness with our Savior that enables me to hear from him, even when he whispers."


