Highlights From FLC's Council Meeting January 20, 2026



Pastoral Care: Joan Werlein has just contacted me that a service for Lee will be held on March 27th, 2026. We will hold the service in the chapel at (likely) 10am that morning. I visited Paul Marquardt in the hospital this morning. He has been diagnosed with congestive heart

failure but it is not too severe at this point. Prayers for him are warranted. I have also visited with a new prospective member, Amy, who has been worshipping with us over the last several weeks. She is a retired teacher from Sheboygan.

Financial Report: Revenue exceeded expense for the year: 7,181.58. Without transfers coming from investments, we would be significantly behind.

Old Business: The new governance structure consists of 2 groups, Church Council (9 people) and Ministry Teams. This change of governance is not just cutting down the size of the Council but changing the focus to be more intentional to discerning what God is calling us to do. This is similar to the current FLC Bylaws that state the duties of the Council include to lead this congregation in stating its mission, to do long-range planning, to set goals and priorities, and to evaluate its activities in light of its mission and goals.

New Business: The Synod Assembly meeting will be held on June 4-6 in Oshkosh. They will be re-electing a bishop. Linda and Ron Jurgens have volunteered to be FLC's delegates to attend. David Bowman and Kate Dorner have volunteered to be on the Nominating Committee from Council. We have gotten more focused in our finances, and Burbey has helped us organize our finances. We are faithfully stewarding our funds. We decided to give the 2026 First For God money again to Grow It Forward, Crossways, Lutheran Social Services and InCourage. Our Lenten series will be themed around "Good Soil". Stephanie Bowman is working on developing this focus this year. It will involve some experiences of dinner church and will explore themes around – Created for Good Soil, Composting, Weeds, Community, and Laying Fallow/Rest.

Please Note: All are welcome to listen in at the church Council Meetings which are held the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 6:30pm, except in July. If you have concerns, questions and comments, please reach out to our Council President, Landie Van Haren, Pastor Andy or other Council Members. A complete copy of the minutes, once approved at the following month's meeting, will be available on the bulletin board in the Fireside Room or in the church office.

Some say his musical style is too close to popular music, some believe any music adopted so widely means it can't be suitable for church, some honor him among contemporary composers. His entire musical output includes, of course, a few misses, but on the whole he is a musician with an ear for

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY

Grace and peace to you in the name of our living and loving Savior, Jesus the Christ.

“The human race is, was and probably always will be deeply unwilling to accept a human Messiah. We don't want to be saved in our humanity; we want to be fished out of it. We crucified Jesus, not because he was God, but because he blasphemed: He claimed to be God and then failed to come up to our standards for assessing the claim. It's not that we weren't looking for the Messiah; it's just that he wasn't what we were looking for. Our kind of Messiah would come down from a cross. He would carry a folding phone booth in his back pocket. He wouldn't do a stupid thing like rising from the dead. He would do a smart thing like never dying.” (Hunting the Divine Fox, Robert Capon p. 91)

I have read and reread this quote many times during my ministry. It is like one of those puzzles that deepens in meaning over time. I have used it in a sermon or two, and yet no matter how often I return to it, it always makes me stop and think.

How do I expect Jesus to be a divinely appointed Messiah today? Do I look for one who can leap tall buildings in a single bound, cure disease with a wave of his hand, and turn stones into bread to feed the world?

And in doing so, how do I fail to see the ways the real Messiah—the real Jesus—is already active in our world? The One who became flesh and dwelled among us is still dwelling among us: wherever two or three are gathered, in the breaking of the bread, when the needy are fed, clothed, and embraced, when God's love is made known.

How often do I place my own expectations and assumptions on how God should act, rather than allowing God to be God? A God who blows like the wind. A God who crosses boundaries I cannot. A God who creates and sustains life where our world will not.

Easter is coming. It is coming a bit early this year—perhaps there is some mercy in that. On Easter, we rightly marvel at the astonishing way God overcomes death and brings life into our world. Yet the life God brings from death is grounded in the concrete reality that Jesus was truly human. Jesus was crucified. Jesus truly died.

That event shatters our expectations of what God should, could, or would do. It breaks the mold of how we think salvation ought to happen. It grounds us in the painful reality of life as it was, as it has been through the centuries, and as it is now. And more than that, it reveals that God's will for human life, shown to us in Jesus, is different from what we often imagine.

So I invite you, as we move toward Easter together, to let go of your expectations—your assumptions, your ideas about how or where God should be at work in our world. Let go, and discover anew the ways God is already at work in ways we do not expect. Discover how God, through Jesus and in the presence of the Spirit, is living among us for the salvation of the whole world.

This Lent and Easter season, let go of what binds and blinds you, and see God anew.

I look forward to doing that with you, brothers and sisters.

First Lutheran Church's Past, Present And Future For Lutheran World Relief Missions

For the past 20 years, I have been keeping track of mission kits and quilts which were sent to Lutheran World Relief. Records began in 1983 for quilts made by the women of FLC. Here are some of those amazing statistics:

Year	Number Of Quilts Sent
1983	8
1996	100
2000	300
2002 – 2004	1,000+ quilts per year
2005	765
2006 - 2012	1,000+ quilts per year
2013	1286 (highest ever)
Past 43 years	21,810 total

The other Mission Kit records began in 2009.

- School Kits over 17 years totaled 3,265
 - Layettes or Baby Care Kits over 17 years totaled 1,655
 - Sewing Kits / Fabric Kits over 17 years totaled 273
 - Personal Care Kits / Health Care Kits over 17 years totaled 2,046
- Over 10 years there were 725 bars of hand soap donated

- Present time numbers 2024-2025

- School Kits 163
- Layettes or Baby Care Kits 71
- Sewing Kits / Fabric Kits 5
- Personal Care Kits / Health Care Kits 106
- Quilts 309

FLC has had great numbers over the past 17 years – well done !! But what about the future?

At the present time, there are about 10 volunteer quilters who work on Monday and 6 others who come when they can. The number of volunteers has diminished since Covid. Health issues and changes in living arrangements also contributed to reduced volunteer workers. No matter the number of volunteer workers, it's a slow but steady service to show God's love to those in need.

Currently there are no plans in place to continue making School, Personal Care or Baby Care Kits as there is no volunteer coordinator to collect and assembly items needed for each kit. I will be stepping down from coordinating the Mission Kits for 2026.

I will continue to work with the Snip 'N Sew volunteer workers for as long as I am able. Should anyone decide to volunteer as a coordinator or worker for the Mission Kits, I am happy to provide procedures, tips and "how to" information to help answer any of your questions or concerns. Sales for kit items usually start in May and these sales are a great resource to stretch funds. The future of the Lutheran World Relief Mission Kits from FLC is in your hands. Assembling kits is a wonderful gift – your heart is warmed knowing that you have made a great difference in many needy persons' lives. It is a memorable experience for you and the recipients. Please talk to God to get his guidance on your involvement in the FLC Mission for LWR.
