We're halfway through another Friday Lunch season! Thank you to everyone who has helped in any way. Every meal prepared, every hour volunteered, and every financial donation has made a meaningful difference.

So far this summer, we have served approximately 25 different guests and are averaging about 12 people each Friday. One exciting addition this year has been inviting members of the wider community to partner with us in preparing and serving meals. The response has



been wonderful! We've enjoyed welcoming new faces into our kitchen while also raising awareness about homelessness and the needs of our neighbors. In July, we hosted a Resource Fair during Friday Lunches. Nine nonprofit organizations joined us to share information about services available to individuals experiencing homelessness. It was a wonderful day, and many valuable connections were made.

Perhaps the most meaningful part of this season has been seeing several former guests return—not because they are still experiencing homelessness, but because they missed the sense of community they found at Friday Lunches. We were delighted to welcome them back with open arms. We have always hoped that Friday Lunches would offer more than just a meal, and seeing those lasting relationships continue is a beautiful reminder of what God is doing through this ministry.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ANDY



Grace and peace to you, friends and members of First. I pray you are well.

As we swelter through these dog days of July, my mind is already beginning to turn toward fall. Yes, fall! We have several opportunities coming up this season for education, fellowship, and growing together in faith, and I'm excited to share them with you.



First, beginning **August 27**, we'll launch a new lunch group called **Living Bread Together**. This adult gathering will meet at **11:30am on the fourth Thursday of each month** to share a meal, spend a little time in devotion, and sing a favorite hymn or two. We plan to gather until about **1:00pm**, and we'll accept a **\$5 per person donation** to help cover the cost of the meal. Mark your calendar for August 27! Our hope is to continue meeting through November before taking a winter break and resuming again in the spring.

Second, I'm preparing a new adult education class that will begin **September 20**. Together we'll explore the ELCA's newest social statement, *Faith and Civic Life: Seeking the Well-being of All*, which was approved at the 2025 Churchwide Assembly. This social statement is intended to aid reflection, shape conscience, and guide the ELCA's teaching and policy on contemporary social issues. It offers a framework for congregations, individuals, and faith communities to discern how we are called to live faithfully in civic life. As we enter another election season and the issues of the fall come into sharper focus, I believe this study will provide a thoughtful and faithful guide for our conversations.



Finally, if you are part of a family with children in the church, watch for announcements about an upcoming dinner gathering. In light of Connie's retirement, we'd like to spend an evening together talking about faith formation, sharing ideas, and discerning the future direction of our youth ministry. I'll be reaching out soon with a date, and I hope you'll consider joining us for this important conversation. **Also, if you have an interest in helping teach Confirmation Classes with me this year, I'd love to hear from you!**

Beyond these opportunities, we continue making progress on several facility projects. As I write this, we're anticipating the start of the upstairs ADA-accessible bathroom project. By the time you read this, we hope the office carpeting and painting will be complete. New sanctuary carpeting is scheduled for late August or early September, with the sound system upgrade expected about a month later.



I'm thoroughly enjoying the summer, but this already sounds like a wonderful beginning to the fall season. I hope you'll join us for these opportunities and many others as we continue to gather, grow, and go together in Christ.

Concert Series Task Force



The CSTF (Concert Series Task Force) has had its first official meeting, and it was a very productive hour. Much time was spent on what time of year is best for our first event. The consensus was that next spring, perhaps April or May, is best for insuring a successful first event. The fall of this year was seen as less desirable, partly because of the busyness of the fall holidays and partly because of the Green Bay Packers schedule! Task Force members seemed to prefer a concert on Sunday afternoon at 2 or 3pm. One artist, an organist recommended by Pastor Andy, got a lot of consideration, but nothing has been finalized. There are still many aspects to consider, such as finances, tickets, length of the concert, tuning of the organ, and whether to have a coffee reception afterward. The only thing decided was that of course we will have coffee reception! Also, the CSTF is looking into arranging an organ concert for its first event, but that does not rule out having future concerts featuring musicians from northeastern Wisconsin, such as choirs, instrumental groups (the Lakeshore Wind Ensemble was mentioned), or collaborations with other churches. We were all surprised to receive a first donation too. We thank the generous member who provided the initial funds. If you would like to contribute, the CSTF will welcome your check. 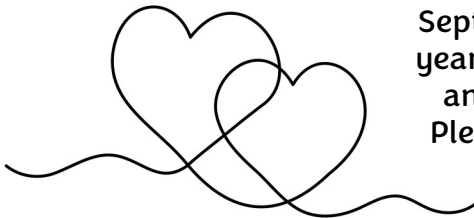

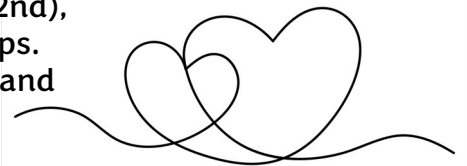
